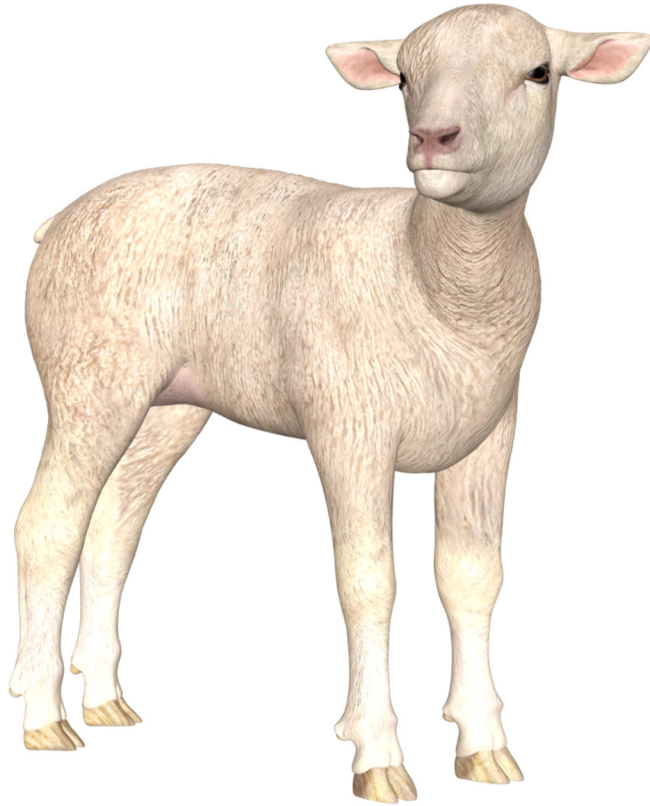


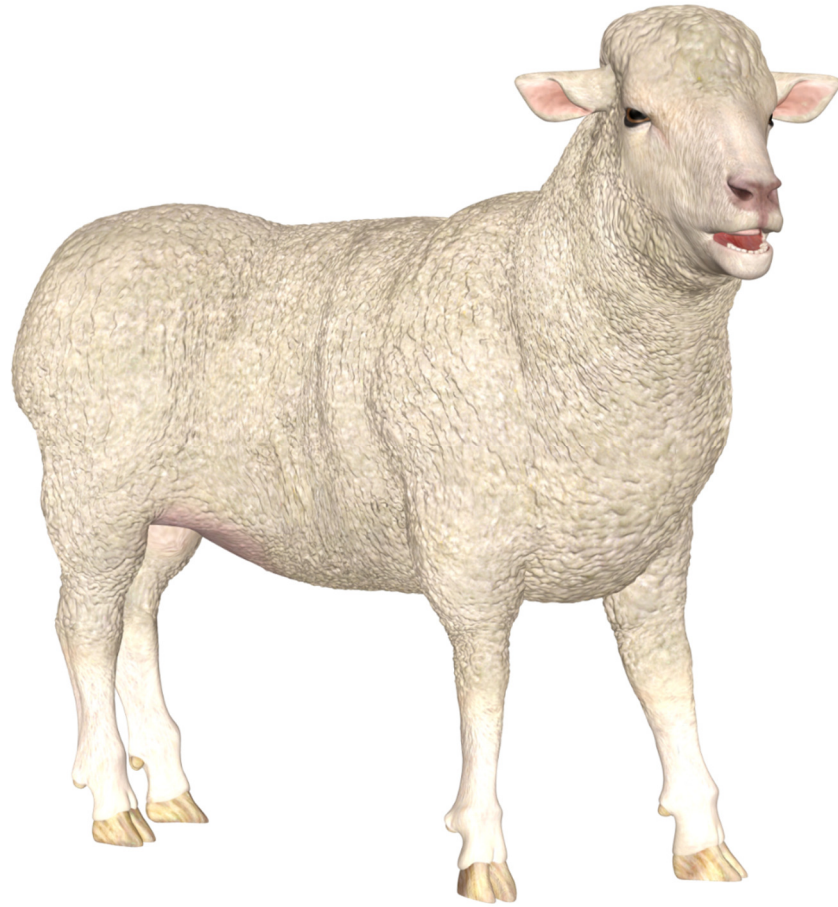

**Little lamb drinks milk from mommy sheep for 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6 months!**



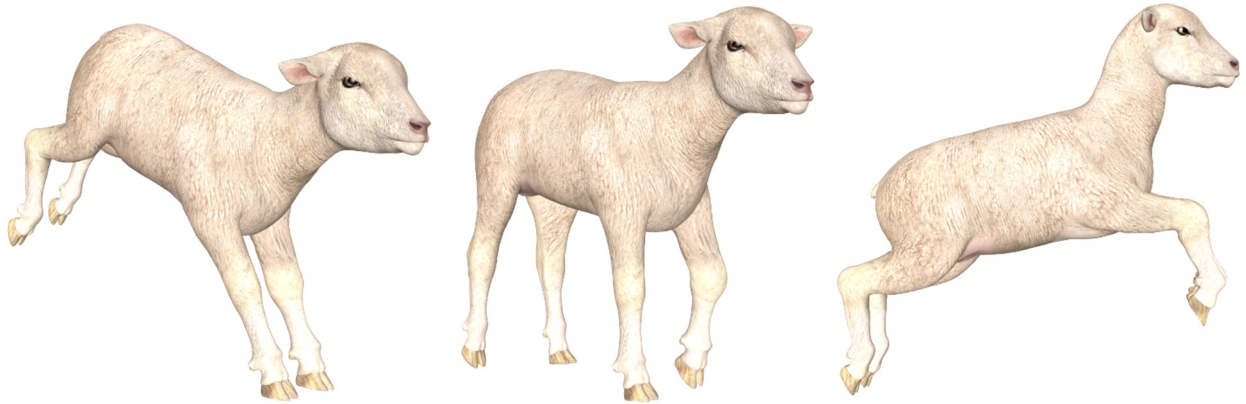
Then little lamb eats grass

mommy sheep.



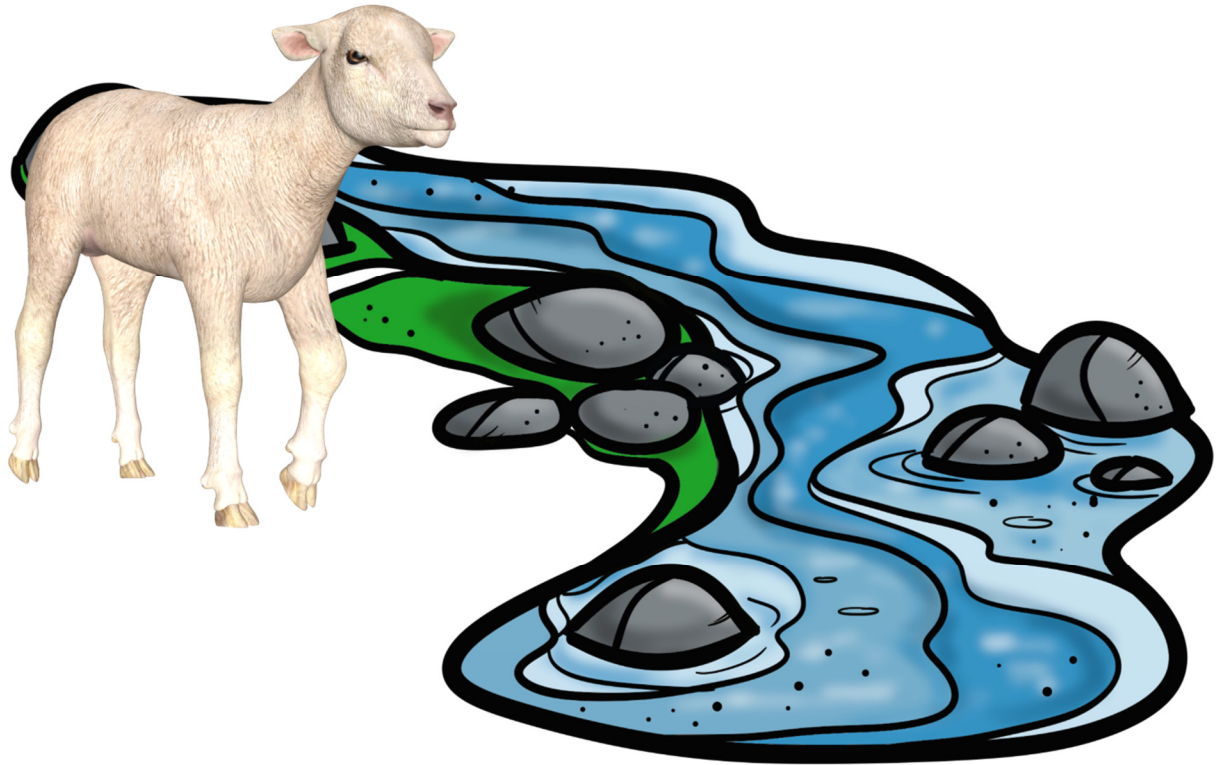
**Little lamb and mommy

pasture. Look at me!**

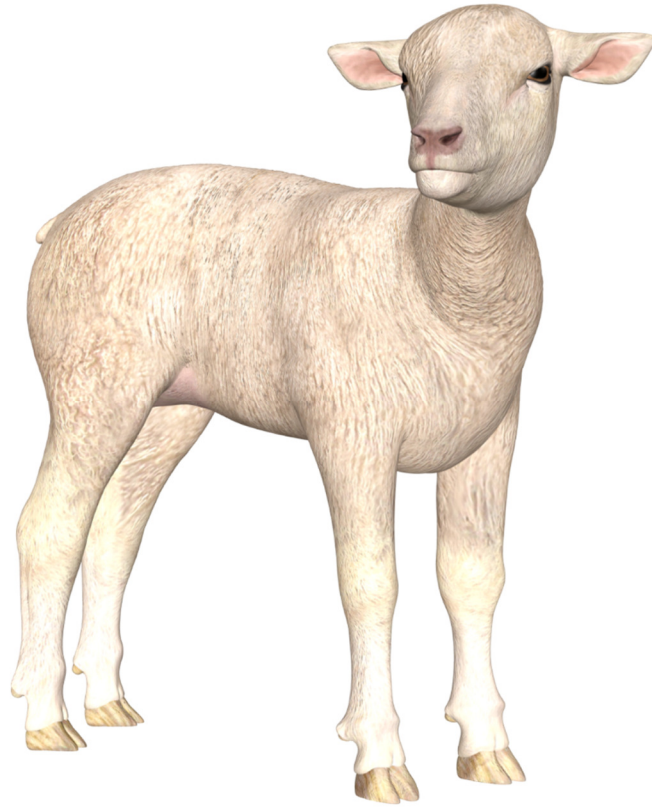
